Jeff Heinrich has been a journalist for over 25 years, mostly with the Montreal Gazette, one of North America's oldest dailies; he worked in the arts, city and business sections from 1989 to 2014. On special assignment, he covered stories in 28 countries on four continents, from the fall of the Berlin Wall and the African AIDS pandemic to the inauguration of Barack Obama and the Israeli pullout from Gaza, as well as producing off-the-news stories on things like Burgundy wine and Czech music. In 2008, he co-authored Circus Quebecus, a French-language book about religion, immigration and ethnicity in contemporary Quebec. He has studied journalism in Ottawa, New York, Los Angeles and Paris; taught journalism in Prague and Montreal; and lived in France and Texas. As a freelance journalist, he has written for Time and The Guardian Weekly; as a freelance translator, he has handled feature articles from Le Monde. Married, the father of two children, he lives in the Plateau Mont-Royal, a creative borough in the heart of Montreal.
